Workforce Development Pilot with Rapides Parish School Board

The initiative aims to connect students with local businesses and industry partners to provide job opportunities immediately after graduation. CHRISTUS St. Frances Cabrini Hospital is a proud partner in this effort, mentoring 12 students over the course of the year.




Korilyn Sicuro, CHRISTUS Cabrini Director of Clinical Education, says this new program is key to building a stronger workforce pipeline in Cenla.

Buckle Up for Safety



The CHRISTUS Cabrini Car Seat Safety Program, founded in August of 2022, has given hundreds of local parents peace of mind and assurance of their child's safety while inside a vehicle. Led by Cabrini Nurse Tiuana McDonald and Pediatric Physical Therapist Karen Hayson-Juarez, the program aims to educate and prepare any parent or guardian for safe travels.

"Motor vehicle accidents are the number one cause of injury or death for children in Louisiana," said

McDonald. "But if the child is restrained properly with a booster seat or car seat, the risk of injury or death is greatly reduced."

Upon realizing the importance of proper car seat education, McDonald and Hayson-Juarez knew more could be done to help parents in Cenla better prepare for the event of an accident.

"So often, we were seeing our pediatric patients' car seats were installed incorrectly, or sometimes not at all," said Hayson-Juarez. "It was really important

that we do some sort of outreach so that [parents] could have a resource to ensure their child is as safe as possible."

Within the first four months, the program helped approximately 80 families and was ranked



second in the state for number of car seat checks. Certified as National Child Passenger Safety technicians, both McDonald and Hayson-Juarez are qualified to check and install a variety of car seats including seats specified for special-needs children. This wide-range of expertise provides an opportunity for parents to regularly return for safety check-ups as their child grows and transition.

With continuous Children's Miracle Network funding, the program currently remains number two in the state and helps an average of 20 to 30 families per month.

Car seat checks are available every Thursday from 10:30am to 12:00pm in front of the CHRISTUS Cabrini Women's and Children's Tower.

Children's Miracle Network Partners with LOCAL CHILDREN'S MUSEUM



The newest addition to Alexandria's T.R.E.E. House Children's Museum is a Children's Miracle Network-funded, lowstimulation playroom for any child with light, sound, or tactile sensitivities.

Designed by the

CHRISTUS Cabrini Pediatric Therapy team, the new play area is specifically designed to provide a calm, safe space for any child with Sensory Processing Disorder (SPD) to play and explore in a way that best supports their needs.

Pediatric Occupational Therapist Lesley Saucier said she is honored for Cabrini Pediatric Therapy Center (CPTC) to be a part of this endeavor, and feels a responsibility to advocate on behalf of her patients for more community inclusion.

"Our mission here at Cabrini is to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ," said Saucier. "That doesn't end when our patients and their families walk out of our clinic doors."

Children with SPD are unable to take in and effectively respond to sensory information received by their neurological systems. This often means they cannot tolerate loud or crowded environments, making it difficult, if not impossible, to participate in typical children's activities.

"This low-stimulation space gives children with sensory processing challenges a fun place to play and engage with their peers, while also providing their families an opportunity to interact and participate in the community," said Saucier. In cooperation with the sensory-specific playroom, CPTC has provided training for T.R.E.E. House staff on how to identify children who might benefit from low-stimulation, and which accommodations are most beneficial to each child.

Above all, T.R.E.E. House and Cabrini Pediatric Therapy Center hope that their partnership will raise awareness for Sensory Processing Disorder in the community, support the needs of all local families, and help create a more inclusive Cenla.

Safe Travels with the CHRISTUS Cabrini NICU

As a Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, The CHRISTUS Cabrini NICU cares for any baby born after 23 weeks of gestation. Many times, this means transporting a sick infant from one of its 13 surrounding rural parishes.

Thanks to Children's Miracle Network donors, the CHRISTUS Cabrini NICU can now transport patients using a NxtGen Transport Incubator (NTI) to provide a higher level of care than ever before. Candace Nichols, CHRISTUS Cabrini NICU Nurse Practitioner, says the NTI is essentially a "NICU on wheels."

The most prominent feature of the new transport isolette is Servo Control—the ability to monitor and automatically adjust a baby's temperature.

"Unstable temperatures lead to a much higher rate of morbidity," said Nichols. "Servo Control is extremely important for avoiding complications while transporting our patients."

In addition, the NTI can provide a greater level of stability for any patient requiring ventilation during a transport. "There will now be much less trauma to a baby's lungs while transporting on a ventilator," said Nichols. "The new isolette will automatically adjust oxygen levels according to the baby's lung compliance."

The Cabrini NICU is one of the first Level III units in the state to utilize an NTI, making Cabrini a top-choice for any newborn transport.

Thanks to CMN funding, the NxtGen Transport Incubator is just one more way that CHRISTUS St. Frances Cabrini hospital can provide the most advanced care for even its smallest patients.

Revamping Rehab

Thanks to CHRISTUS Cabrini Foundation donors, the CHRISTUS Cabrini Physical Rehabilitation Center now offers more advanced, life-enhancing therapy through the use of Bioness technology.

The L300 Foot Drop System is a remote-controlled device that utilizes electrical stimulation, allowing a person to walk with little-to-no physical limitation. The device benefits any patient with neurological impairments—most notably, those suffering from stroke, multiple sclerosis, traumatic brain injury, or spinal cord injury.

"The L300 makes it possible for patients with neurological deficits to build strength and coordination for the basic function of walking, allowing our therapists to guide our patients toward more advanced goals," said Stacey Belgard, CHRISTUS Cabrini Director of Physical Therapy.

In addition, Cabrini's physical rehab center now utilizes the Bioness Integrated Therapy System (BITS). This all-in-one therapy tool is designed with a variety of techniques and programs to improve vision, motor, cognition, and balance skills.

The BITS tracks the progress of each patient's customized treatment plan and provides instant feedback on skill development.

"I'm so excited for what this new equipment is doing for our program," said Belgard. "We already had great, hands-on care, but these pieces have really advanced our treatment and helped us offer the latest in therapy technology."

Each memorial purchased directly supports the hospital, providing necessities like new hightech equipment, patient programs, or advanced training for our associates. Reed was born via emergency C-Section at 26 weeks when his mom Kari suddenly developed pregnancyinduced Hellp Syndrome. Weighing only 1 pound and 15 ounces, Reed lived in a CMN-funded Omni Isolette for almost 3 months. The Omni Isolette provided a substitute womb for Reed's continued development while he received around-the-clock, intensive care



from the highly trained Cabrini Neonatal Intensive Care staff. Thanks to the life-saving, CMN-funded equipment and the Cabrini NICU staff, Reed and his mom are now at home getting ready for his 1st birthday.



MEET L.B.

L.B. began experiencing regular wheezing and breathing problems while attending Lessie Moore Elementary School in Pineville, Louisiana. The dedicated staff at Lessie Moore's CMN-funded School-Based Health Center quickly identified the issue and began treating him for chronic asthma. After receiving daily treatment administered by a full-time registered nurse, L.B.'s asthma is well managed and under control, allowing him to run, play, and climb like any other kid his age.
